More than 9,000 books donated to help children and families in need

Colorado Springs, CO, May 3, 2018 – We would like to thank generous community members, local businesses, PPUW partner agencies, nonprofits, churches and local media who contributed to the success of this year’s book drive! Thanks to your efforts, we collected 9,103 books for children and families in need! This is a huge increase from the 2017 April book drive, when 1,397 books were collected. Pikes Peak United Way and EPIC (Executives Partnering to Invest in Children) partner each year to collect books for children ages birth to age eight. Since 2013, EPIC has distributed nearly 500,000 books to children and families in Colorado. Volunteers spent the past couple of days sorting thousands of books. All donated books are given to children and families in need through local elementary schools, nonprofits, libraries, doctor’s offices and child care centers. Children’s books, when paired with positive adult-child interactions, provide a critical foundation for healthy early childhood development.
