Hundreds of families to receive meals at Pikes Peak United Way, Care and Share food distribution

Dec. 22, 2020 — Pikes Peak United Way and Care and Share Food Bank will hold a free food distribution Dec. 23 to provide food boxes to around 500 families for the holiday season. The distribution is at Mitchell High School, 1205 Potter Drive, and begins at 10:30 a.m.

As the COVID-19 pandemic hit the Pikes Peak region, PPUW and Care and Share's twice-monthly food distributions at Mitchell High School became essential to addressing the growing problem of student hunger. This spring, we quickly went from giving out 10,000 pounds of food at each distribution to 35,000 pounds. Each distribution serves 400 to 500 families.

Due to the pandemic, the distributions are drive up-style. Attendees are asked to remain in their vehicles and follow traffic instructions from our volunteers once they arrive. A separate line is available for those who walk or take the bus.

This is a bonus distribution held on one of our off weeks to ensure that families in need have enough food for the holidays. After this event, the next distribution is scheduled for Jan. 14, 2021.

Members of the media are invited to attend the distribution but asked not to publicize it ahead of time. Representatives from Pikes Peak United Way will be available for interviews.
